Funeral Services

Funeral arrangements should be made by the family with the Parish Office prior to making final preparations with the funeral home.



Ongoing Care

Bereavement Ministers schedule an Initial Visit with the family of the deceased and then over the course of the first year following a loss, the ministry members will send monthly messages, cards, and plan supplemental personal visits with the family.

The program is very flexible and has been found to be helpful to family members following the loss of a loved one. The Bereavement Ministry Program follows the guidelines designed by Ave Maria Press®.
